

SCCPSS Board Approves Two Measures Regarding Return to Learn Plan

At the Regular Meeting of the Board on Wednesday, November 4, 2020 – a motion was approved stating the hybrid plan's success is directly linked to having enough teachers and staff in buildings to meet the needs of students selecting in-person learning. Therefore, teachers and staff in general, except those who qualify for an exemption under board policy, will be required to return to work at their assigned building/work site when Chatham County's CTI is at or below 100, or as of December 31, 2020, when the CARES ACT expires, whichever occurs first.

Thresholds for Virtual Learning: MOTION APPROVED

Also at the Regular Meeting, a motion was passed stating the District's implementation and continuation of in-person learning should be driven by data. If the time comes that Chatham County's spread of COVID increases rapidly, the district must be prepared to take appropriate actions up to and including a districtwide transition back to fully virtual learning. Therefore, if Chatham County's transmission of COVID increases to the point that our area's CTI, Percentage of Positive Tests, and Daily Case Rate per 100,000 are all in the Red transmission level, as reported by the Coastal DPH, a districtwide transition back to virtual learning will be implemented for all students, with teachers delivering virtual instruction from their assigned worksite. Returning to hybrid in-person learning will occur when one of these 3 metrics remains lower than a RED transmission level for at least 14 calendar days.

2020 SCCPSS Graduation Rate Sets New Record, Once Again Surpasses State and National Rates

The Georgia Department of Education has released SY 2019-20 graduation rates for the Savannah-Chatham County Public School System. SCCPSS improved its cohort graduation rate by nearly two percentage points over last year – rising from 87.8% to 89.7%. That number surpasses the state rate for the sixth year in a row.

Fleet Management Software Contract Approved for Transportation

The Board approved a contract with Synovia Solutions to install equipment and provide software that will enable the Transportation Department to verify routes and track student ridership in real time and by historical data. Time and attendance of bus drivers and monitors will be managed by mobile data terminals that will provide a vehicle inspection system and two-way messaging with managers. Parents will be able to view real-time bus locations and movements online by using the "Here Comes the Bus" application. This software will integrate with our current routing software (Transfinder) and will replace our current GPS software (Zonar). Total cost to be billed to the District is \$500,484.00 over a period of two (2) years.

Postsecondary Accelerated Options

The Informal Meeting of the Board also featured a report of Postsecondary Accelerated Options including Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment and International Baccalaureate participation and outcomes data from the 2019-20 School Year. Highlights include: 1,952 students successfully completed one or more AP, IB, or dual enrollment courses. The district's PAO completion rate was 21%, with school rates ranging from 4% to 60%.
